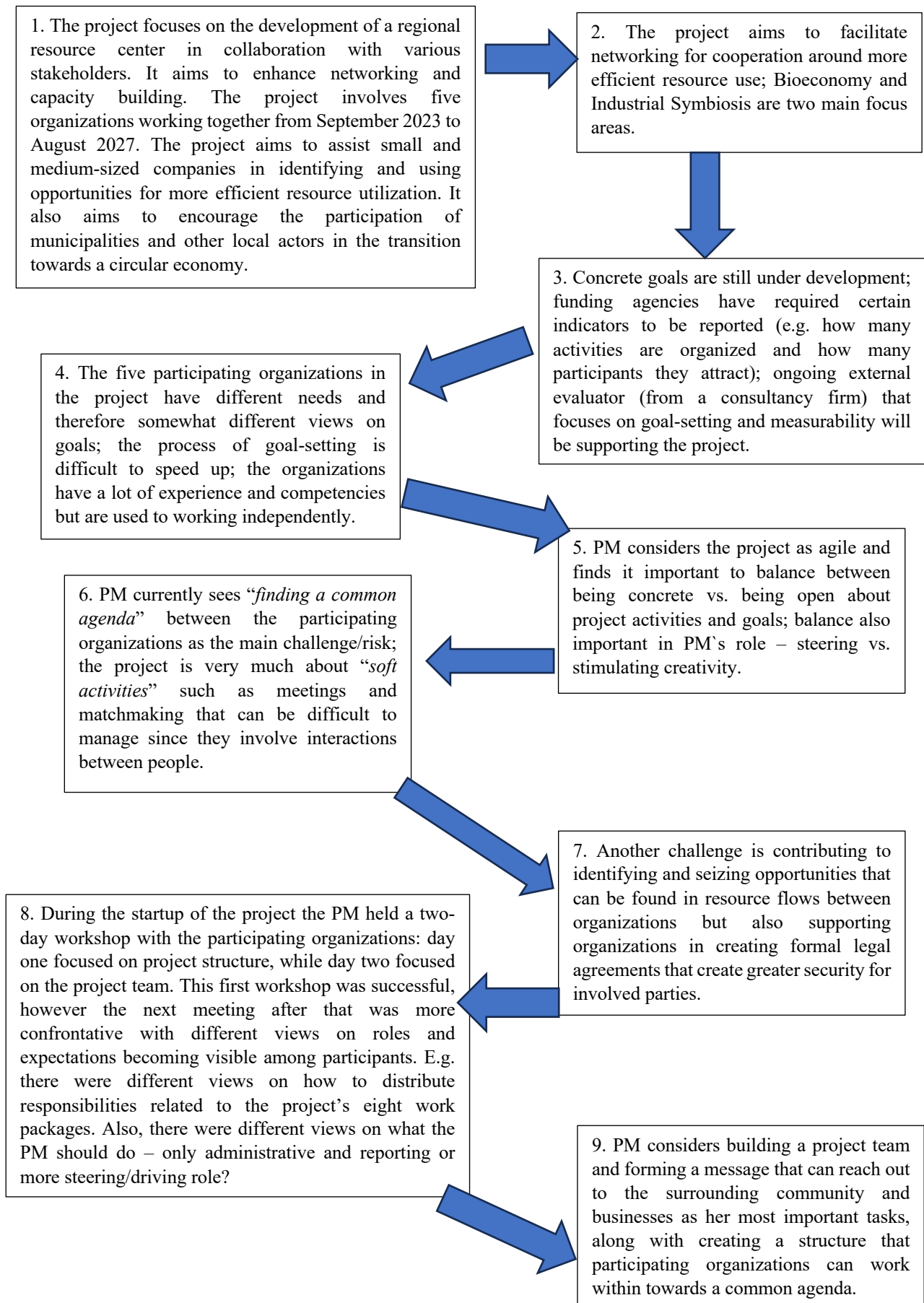


Swedish Mini-Case: Establishment of a Regional Circular Economy Center in Sweden: Project managers (PM) view.
